Advent: A Time of Preparation

Have you ever seen the movie, "Twister?" This movie came out in 1996 starring Helen Hunt and Bill Paxton. They play two storm chasers who must work together to create an advanced weather alert system by putting themselves in the cross-hairs of extremely violent tornadoes. At the climax of the film, they find themselves in the direct path of a tornado and unless they can find something to hold on to, they will be sucked into the storm. They're on a farm and run into an old well house that has pipes that go deep into the ground. Using a thick leather strap they are able to secure themselves to the pipes and as the storm passes over them, they are caught up in it but not blown away by it because they are anchored deep into the ground.

As I enter this season of Advent, I must confess that I feel like I'm caught up in a violent storm. As I look at the world around me and as I look at the world within me, I feel like my heart is being beaten down by the winds of confusion, suffering, and a general feeling of powerlessness. Maybe some of you can relate.

Advent is a season of preparation. Sometimes, especially when we're feeling like we have no control over anything, the best way to prepare for whatever comes next is to find our anchor, strap in, and hold tight to what we know to be true. For Christians, this truth is found in our Baptismal identity. No matter what storm rages around us, the one thing that cannot be taken away, diminished, or destroyed is who we are in Christ.

You are God's child. God loves you. You bring God great joy!

Tish Harrison Warren, in her book *Liturgy of the Ordinary*, wrote: "We are marked from our first waking moment by the identity that is given to us by grace: an identity that is deeper and more real than any other identity we will don that day."

So this Advent, I invite you to strap in, hold tight and be grounded in God's deep and abiding love for you. I've preached it before and now I desperately need to hear the message once again... God's got you and God's got this.
