**THE KAREN CHRISLEY SCHOLARSHIP IS OFFERED TO ELIGIBLE PERSONS WHO WANT TO
FURTHER THEIR EDUCATION AND WHO MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:**

The Enon United Methodist Church Karen Chrisley scholarship fund committee (hereafter referred to as "the committee") are the administrators of the scholarship.

- 1) Completed applications from students must be returned to the Enon UMC in an appropriate time as specified each year by the committee.
- 2) A qualified applicant must be enrolled in an accredited school, college, or university and shall have completed at least one term (quarter or semester). Further, the applicant may be asked to submit their grades.
- 3) The scholarship is given annually and is not renewable. The amount and number of the scholarships awarded will be determined by the committee and may vary depending on available funds.
- 4) Scholarship(s) will be presented to the selected recipient(s) by the UMC Scholarship Committee and the Pastor during a Sunday Worship service, typically on "Student Sunday" (usually last Sunday in November) if possible.
- 5) Unused scholarship funds: If the funds are not used for a particular year (no qualified applicants), the committee may seek a charity that adheres to the current United Methodist Church's social principles and apply funds to that charity.
- 6) The geographical area of applicants will not be restricted to the Enon, Ohio area.
- 7) The scholarship award payments will come from the interest of the fund, and not the principal.
- 8) The committee has the sole right of investment decisions.
- 9) The committee will review all applicants and may choose to interview the top applicants to make a final award decision.
- 10) In the event the Enon UMC should ever fail to continue as a church, the scholarship fund will be transferred to another church entity as determined by the committee and is to be administered in the same manner as Enon UMC administered the funds.
